Basant Kumar Birla group of companies earned the prestigious AACSB Accreditation in Oct 2022. With this coveted international recognition, BIMTECH has joined the elite club of AACSB Accredited B-schools in India and abroad. The US-based accrediting body i.e. Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) Accreditation is considered to be a Gold standard in management education. It provides a framework of 15 international standards on which B-Schools worldwide assess the quality of their education. For BIMTECH, AACSB accreditation opens the possibilities for more collaborative research (at national and international levels), and more faculty and student exchanges.
